Members in British Championships

The annual event for the British Chess championships is this year being held at Blackpool, commencing next Monday, and in which both Mr. and Mrs. Michell, of the Kingston Chess Club, are taking part. Altogether there will be about 130 players divided into sections of about 12 players each. Mr. Michell will be playing in the British championship section and Mrs. Michell in the British women's championship.

Mr. Michell also recently played in Holland in connection with a 10-aside match between England and Holland; which event is now going to be an annual one; the Dutch team coming to England next year.

Several members of the Kingston Chess Club have been playing prominently in the Surrey summer tournament matches at the St. Bride's Institute, London, Mrs. Michell, Mrs. Shannon, Dr. Letchworth and Mr. Ellam being in the Slater-Kennington Cup contest; the scores being, Mrs. Michell four, Mrs. Shannon $3\frac{1}{2}$, Dr. Letchworth five, and Mr. Ellam $4\frac{1}{2}$ with one game to play and one for adjudication. In the Felce Cup section Mr. Newman has $2\frac{1}{2}$ games, and in the Wernick Cup Mr. Hartnell is a very likely second with $6\frac{1}{2}$ games, Mr. Gibbs having $2\frac{1}{2}$.

In the Kingston club's summer tournament, which is held at the Zeeta Café, on Saturday evenings, the present leading scores are: Section A, Mr. J. M. Ellam, five games; Mr. E. Stevens, three, and Mr. E. Hartnell, two. In section B, Messrs. G. Giles, J. P. Hutchings, and W. Watts have three games each. There is still time and room for any prospective member to join this tournament.
